Re: Announcing WCUnderwriting

In an effort to provide a more efficient transfer of information to our carrier partners, the North Carolina Rate Bureau (NCRB) is pleased to announce that North Carolina intra-state experience modifications are now available via the WCUnderwriting Web Service through the CDX platform. The CDX WCUnderwriting Web Service is a Business-to-Business (B2B) Web Service that provides immediate access to participating Data Collection Organization (DCO) data for experience modification factors, merit rating factors and other peripheral pricing information. The service allows DCO approved carriers to request experience modifications by Risk IDs and/or FEIN for the specified date range. The data returned adheres to the WCIO WCUnderwriting data specification file layout.

Please see the included CDX WCUnderwriting Carrier Implementation Guide for further information on how to begin utilizing the service as well as sample XML file layouts (requests/responses).

Introduction

The CDX WCUnderwriting Web Service is a Business-to-Business (B2B) RESTful Web Service that provides immediate access to participating Data Collection Organization (DCO) data for experience modification factors, merit rating factors and other peripheral pricing information. The service allows filtering by Risk IDs, FEIN/NJTINs and date range and data returned adheres to the WCIO WCUnderwriting data specification file layout.

NOTE: This guide contains specifications for DE, NC, NJ, PA and WI. As additional DCOs adopt this new service, their rules will be added.

Obtaining DCO Authorization Keys


In order to issue calls to the CDX WCUnderwriting service, carriers must obtain an authorization key for each DCO they wish to query. To generate an authorization key, a CDX primary administrator or an authorized CDX user must log in to the CDX application and navigate to Admin | My UMG. From here, the user has two choices:

1. **Obtain Authorization Keys at the Carrier Group Level:** While viewing the group, click the Web Service Setup tab. Click the Request DCO Approval button for the requested DCO(s). Note that DCOs will not display on this page if they do not permit setup at the group level.

2. **Obtain Authorization Keys for each Carrier NCCI Code:** Go to Carriers, select a carrier, and select Web Service Setup. Select the Request DCO Approval for each DCO/NCCI Code.

To request approval to utilize the CDX WCUnderwriting web service, select the **Request DCO Approval** button for the appropriate DCO. Some DCOs may require you to be approved for **Single Sign-On** in order to initiate the setup process. The person initiating the request will receive an email notification from CDX when the DCO approves or rejects your request. If approved, a link will appear to access the Authorization Key. The **Get Authorization Key** link can only be used once. If you need to generate a new Authorization Key, use the **Regenerate** option. To withdraw your request to use the WCUnderwriting web service for a DCO, click the **Delete** button.

This DCO requires you to establish a valid SSO connection before you can request an Authorization Key.


Some DCOs require the CDX user to have an established a **Single Sign On account** with the DCO in order to request setup. If required, a message will display on the setup page providing guidance.

The user must click **Request DCO Approval** to initiate the process of establishing a relationship between the carrier and the DCO. This must be done for each DCO. DCO processing rules vary where some DCOs will return an Approved/Rejected status immediately. Other DCOs might require additional documentation and review in order to approve use and those DCOs will return a Pending status. If needed, those DCO(s) will follow-up with the user that initiated the request. Once approved or denied, CDX will send an email to the user with the status.

When a DCO has approved a request, the user must access the Web Service Setup page and click the **Get Authorization Key** link.

To request approval to utilize the CDX WCUnderwriting web service, select the **Request DCO Approval** button for the appropriate DCO. Some DCOs may require you to be approved for **Single Sign-On** in order to initiate the setup process. The person initiating the request will receive an email notification from CDX when the DCO approves or rejects your request. If approved, a link will appear to access the Authorization Key. The **Get Authorization Key** link can only be used once. If you need to generate a new Authorization Key, use the **Regenerate** option. PCRB has approved your request. Please use the "Get Authorization Key" link to generate your key.

A pop-up will appear with the key. The user must save this key from the pop-up as it will not be available after the pop-up is closed. At any point in time, the carrier can request a new key by clicking the **Regenerate** button. The authorization key will need to be passed into all calls to the CDX WCUnderwriting web service requests.

Calling the CDX WcUnderwriting Web Service

To request data, submit a POST HTTPS request and use the XML schema that is found in Appendix A of this document. The following data must be provided:

Receiving Search Results

After submitting your search request, CDX will pass the request on to each DCO specified. Once each DCO responds, CDX will combine and return the search results in a single XML packet. The XML schema layout for the search results are located on the WCIO.org website under the XML Guides and Schemas section.

While the data returned will conform to the WCIO specifications, there are some variances in what will be returned:

DCO	Comments
DE	If Start and End Date is supplied, returns the Mods/Merits within the date range with a maximum of 20. If Start and End Date is not supplied, returns the most current Mod/Merit.
NC	If Start and End Date is supplied, returns the Mods within the date range (no maximum). If Start and End Date is not supplied, returns all Mods available (no maximum).
NJ	If Start and End Date is supplied, returns the Mods within the date range with a maximum of 5 years. If Start and End Date is not supplied, returns the most current Mod.
PA	If Start and End Date is supplied, returns the Mods/Merits within the date range with a maximum of 20. If Start and End Date is not supplied, returns the most current Mod/Merit.
WI	If Start and End Date is supplied, returns the Mods within the date range with a maximum of 5 years. If Start and End Date is not supplied, returns the most current Mod.

Handling Errors

Within each WCUnderwriting element of the search results, the XML will contain a ResponseCode element and a ResponseMessage element. Possible values for the Response Code are:

- 0 – Success
- 1 – No data found
- 2 – Error, see the ResponseMessage for more information

Maintenance Periods

CDX has reserved maintenance windows on Saturdays and Sundays from 5AM ET – 12PM ET for routine maintenance. In addition, please note that there are times when services need to be brought down after business hours for high priority updates and these typically occur after 9:00PM ET. If there are significant outages planned, CDX will notify the technical contacts on record.

Response Message

If the Response Code equals “1” or “2”, a message with the error description will be also be returned.

Sample Response Messages:

- *No data. Unable to retrieve information: missing key fields*
- *Invalid State Code (This is a numeric field)*
- *Invalid State Code. Valid state: 07, 37*
- *Invalid Risk ID (This is a numeric field)*
- *Invalid Risk ID (Maximum 7 digits field)*
- *FEIN must be numeric*
- *Invalid FEIN Number [all DCO’s besides NJ] (Maximum 9 digits field)*
- *Invalid FEIN Number[NJ only] (Maximum 12 digits field, must end in 000)*
- *Invalid Start Date Format (yyyymmdd)*
- *Invalid End Date Format (yyyymmdd)*
- *Starting and Ending dates cannot have the same value.*
- *Invalid Starting date. (Starting date must be less than Ending date)*
- *Invalid Starting Date (Maximum 8 digits field)*

- *Invalid Ending Date (Maximum 8 digits field)*
- *Invalid Starting Date (This is a numeric field)*
- *Invalid Ending Date (This is a numeric field)*
- *Authorization Failed.*
- *Status Code 401: Credentials are not valid or account is inactive.*

Additional Tips

- The CDX WCUnderwriting Web Service submits your search request to each requested DCO concurrently but will wait for all DCOs to return data. Make sure your system gives CDX enough time to collect all the responses before timing the request out. CDX should provide a response or timeout within 60 seconds.
- The date fields in the search request are nillable. For example, <StartDate i:nil="true"/>. Blank values are not accepted, please specify nil instead.
- In order to ensure reliable access and speed to all users, CDX implements a 5,000 per-day request limit on the CDX WCUnderwriting Web Service. If this limit is reached, subsequent calls will be rejected and can be re-submitted the following day.
